What is the Relevance of Rudolf Steiner's Mystery Plays for Today?

Thomas Meyer brings this topic to light in his discussion of the fourfold human being's path to spiritual knowledge through finding the Christ and recognizing the twofold expression of evil. Steiner's Mystery Plays illustrate essential questions of our modern path of initiation: how to balance the forces of thinking, feeling, and willing; how to solve social problems arising out of karmic knots, and how to relate spiritual experiences to our daily tasks.

Throughout the day we will cover imaginations from specific scenes given by Steiner and work through these to deepening our awakening of our own spiritual nature. The Plays are not an illustration of spiritual scientific ideas, but genuine works of art; and in art we can experience our freedom as human beings. If we freely experience the images and scenes of the Plays we will be all the more prepared for meeting them in real life in our personal destiny and karma.

Reincarnation and Karma as Rudolf Steiner's Core Mission

According to Rudolf Steiner the direct knowledge of reincarnation was starting to fade away living through the ages as mere feeling for its reality. Until in 1860 there began a new spiritual era in which knowledge of reincarnation and karma could be regained in full consciousness. This is when Rudolf Steiner descended to his earthly incarnation to make the first fundamental steps for the fulfillment of this task for millennia. His own life is the best example for the awakening of these new faculties as illustrated by his early awareness of his karmic connection with St. Thomas Aquinas.



Thomas Meyer is a talented world renowned author and lecturer and brings this fascinating topic to our community shortly after the Festival of Easter. He is a former Waldorf High School teacher and also editor and translator for the *Verlag am Goetheanum* as well as founder of the publishing house, *Perseus* (see www.perseus.ch). He is the editor of the monthly *Der Europaer* and currently lives and works as a writer, lecturer and publisher in Switzerland – giving courses and seminars in Basel and Zurich and frequent lectures in Oslo and Budapest. He has written numerous books, such as: *Clairvoyance and Consciousness*, *Light for the new Millennium*, *D. N. Dunlop – A man of our Times* and other historical biographies on prominent pupils of Rudolf Steiner as well as politically charged books on the state of the world today.
